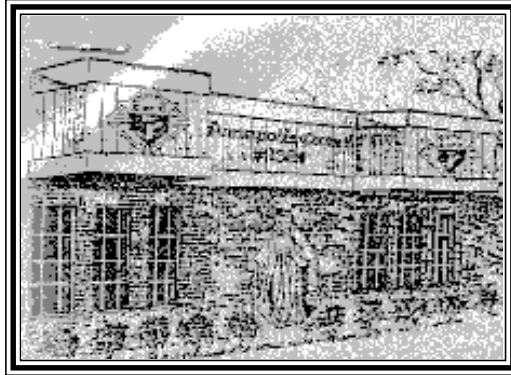

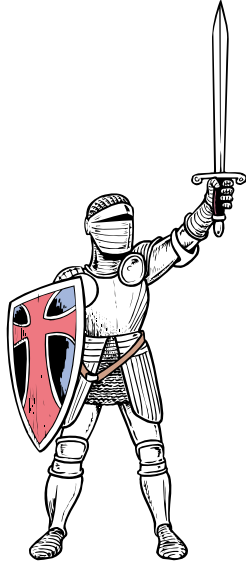

## BINGO REPORT

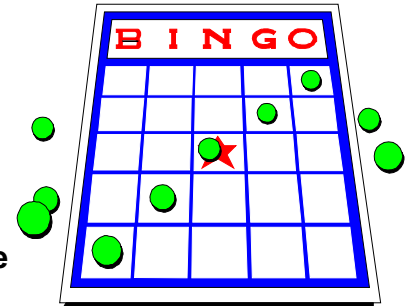
Brothers,

Brothers,

Renewal of membership has been going well. The Second Notice (second time) will be mailed in April to about 87 or 22% that have not paid their dues. If they have not paid their dues by the end of May then suspension notices will go out to them, the State, and Supreme.

All the reports needed to be sent out to the State for the Convention have been forwarded. We also sent in 6 resolutions for the convention. We had a First & Second Degree on March 29<sup>th</sup> that was outstanding. We initiated 13 new member and a transfer. With other Councils having candidates we had a total of 22 for the first degree and 33 for the second. This will maybe get us as a Double Star Council which means we did 200% of the membership quota and 100% of the insurance quota. # Announcements

Your 2008 Bull Roast committee met last night and is in full swing planning and preparing for the event. In attendance were Ray sears, Dale Voss, Roland & Lois Banscher, Dave Brown, Lee Heath, and Joe Woerner.

The Bull roast will be June 21st at the Council. As this is one of our biggest events each year and generates well-needed monies for the community, we need MORE than the committee working on the Bull Roast. The Fire dept does much of the grunt work; which is nice for us for a change; thus WE MUST step up with these other items:

1) Selling tickets: Dave or a committee member will have tickets or tables for you to sell. We are hoping to give each member a stack of tickets to get sold. These ticket sales usually break us even; then the money spent on games, raffles, wheels, auction, etc etc is the profit; thus it is imperative that we get as many people as possible. Selling tickets is EVERY members duty (even if you can't make it yourself)--- spread the word !! Tickets are \$25 each or a table for 10 is \$200. The Fire Dept makes each of their members responsible for buying a table or selling 10 tickets; let's do our part also !!
