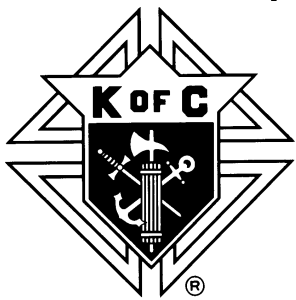


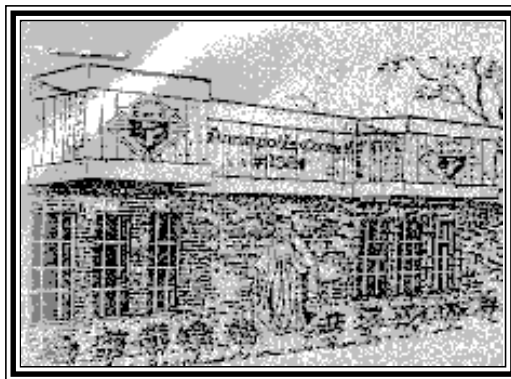

Chaplain's Column - March 2009

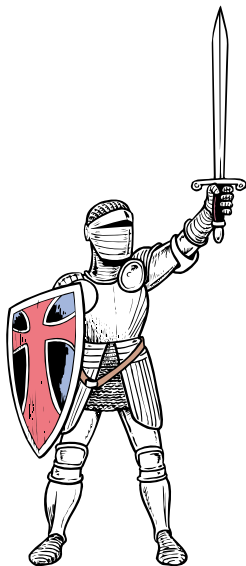

There are generally multiple facets to every celebration, and the 1384 centenary is no exception.

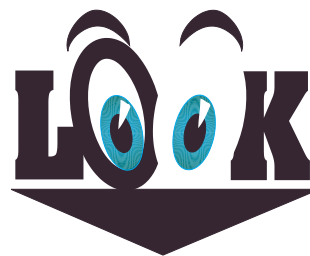

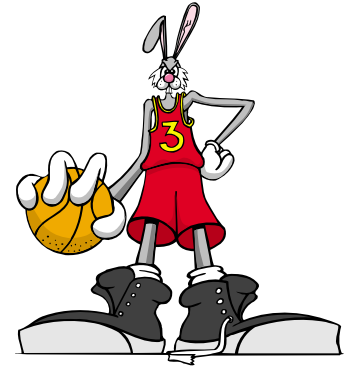

CHURCH ACTIVITIES:

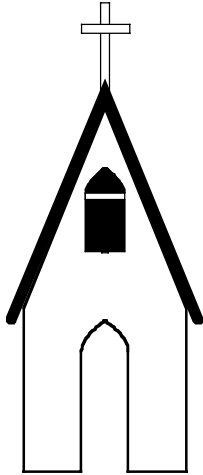
