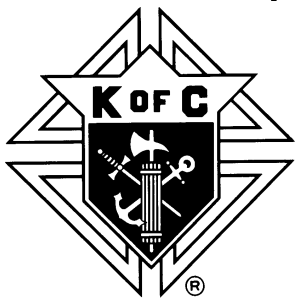
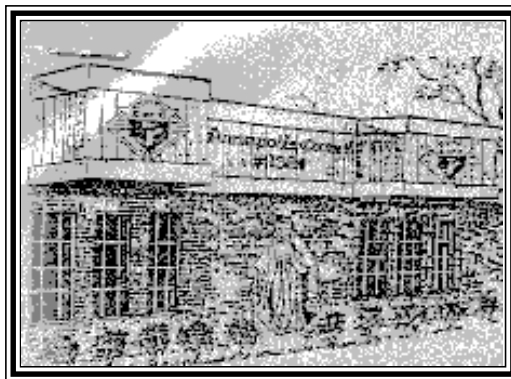

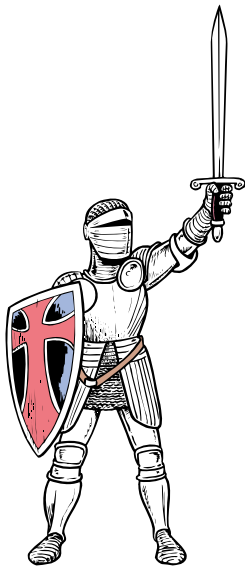


Chaplain's Corner

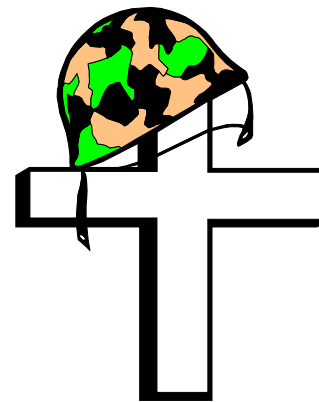

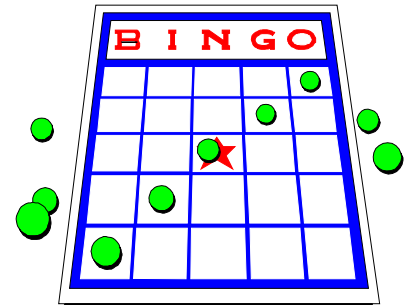
On another note: Brothers, please let you wives/significant other know that they can and should contact me if they need assistance with the Knights in the event it is needed.

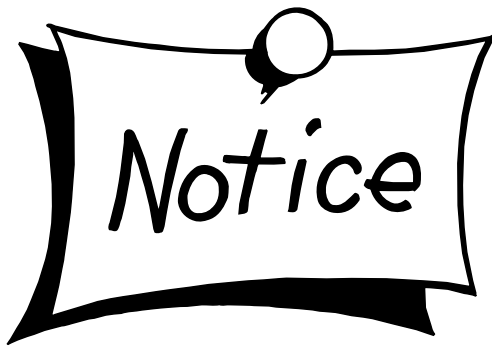

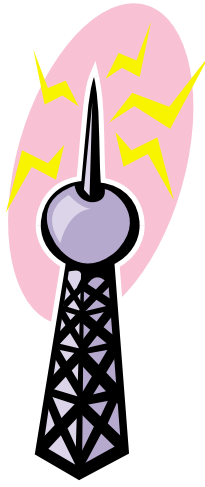

Catholic radio is coming soon to the Chesapeake Bay area, but we need your help! Chesapeake Catholic Radio Inc. (CCR) is a non-profit, 501(c)(3) organization formed in 2007 with the purpose of bringing authentically Catholic radio programming to the Chesapeake Bay area. The board consists of Thomas Lynch, John Lademan, Tom Basil and Tom Hurd. Father McLean Cummings is CCR's chaplain and John Coakley is our administrative assistant.



We recently received permits from the FCC for the construction of two stations, one covering Wilmington, DE and one in Leonardtown, MD and are now trying to raise funds to purchase the needed equipment and pay for the antenna construction for these stations.

Our immediate goal is to raise \$50,000. This will allow us to get the Wilmington station on the air very soon. Our programming will initially consist of a re-broadcast of EWTN's excellent Catholic radio shows – including catechists, talk shows and news – with an eventual goal to provide additional local programming.

We need your support spiritually and financially. Please pray earnestly for the efforts of CCR, because we can't do this without the grace of God. We also ask that you consider making a tax-deductible donation to support the launch of this first station. Even \$25 will help. Although the first stations may not cover your listening area, they will help us move ahead with further development that we pray will eventually cover Annapolis, Baltimore and other major population centers.

Pope John Paul II said that the "positive development of the media at the service of the common good is a responsibility of each and every [Catholic]." 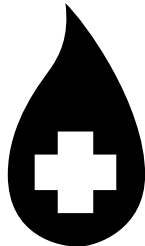
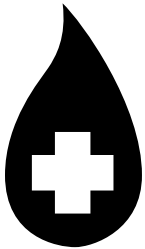

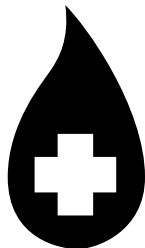


Blood Drive Sunday June 5, 2011 at St. John Neumann 8:00 A.M. to 3:00 P.M.
