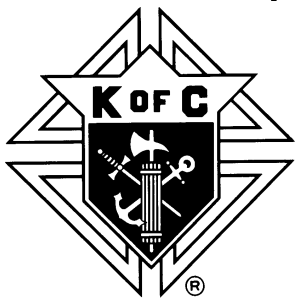
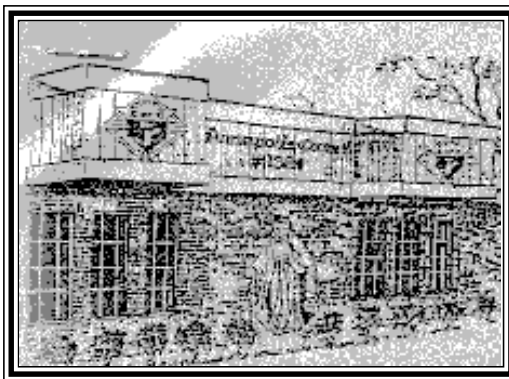

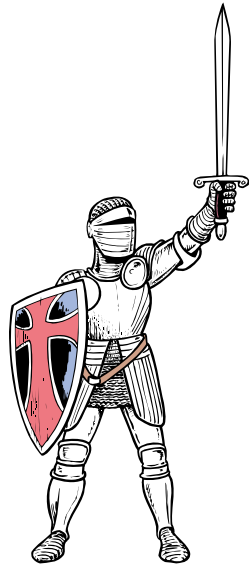

Father David Brault, pastor of St. John's, will be chief celebrant and homilist. Immediately following the Mass, Richard M. Doerflinger will give a brief talk in the Lyon Center, "After 39 Years: Where Does Our Nation Stand on Abortion?" Mr. Doerflinger has advised the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops on pro-life legislation for over 30 years. Light refreshments will be provided. 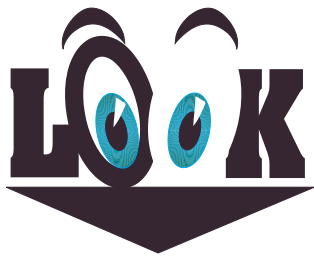
- Bring an alternative, prominently Roman Catholic perspective to current events, people, political and religious controversies in order to sustain and fortify the faith of believing Catholics.

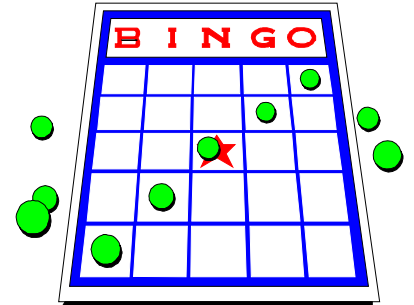
Brothers ALL,

FRANK RISTAINO SCHOLARSHIP FUND

Knights of Columbus, Annapolis Council 1384

Purpose of the Scholarship: The purpose of the scholarship fund is to assist practicing Catholics and their school attending children in meeting the cost of education at accredited Catholic elementary, high school, and parish-supported programs of the Confraternity of Christian Doctrine (CCD)

Eligibility: Relatives of Knights of Columbus, Council 1384 members who are in good standing are eligible to apply for financial aid from this fund. Preference will be given to grades 7 through 12 at parishes and schools that are local to Annapolis.

Award Criteria: Criteria for determining awards include: total number of applicants; financial need based upon suitable financial disclosure; academic record; number of siblings; tuition costs; the one-page essay on “**What a Catholic education means to me;**” any additional information that was considered pertinent to the application; completion of all information on the application; and the degree of active participation in Council 1384 meetings, events, and activities by the sponsor-member of Council 1384. **Failure to submit any of the required credentials will result in elimination from review by the Scholarship Committee.**

Award Amount: The Council has set aside \$9300 for this scholarship fund and awards will be made using criteria outlined above.

Application and Award Dates: Applications are due by January 31 for the school year starting in September, and notification letters will be sent by February 15 of each year. **Late applications will not be considered unless there are legitimate extenuating circumstances that prevented submission by the due date.**

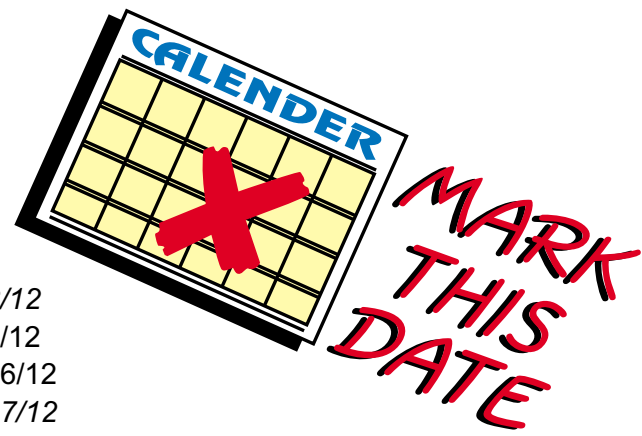
Award Notification: Notification of awards will be made by letter to the recipients and the applicant’s school, with payment to the receiving institution for application to student’s account.

Scholarship Committee: The Scholarship Committee membership and chairman are appointed by the Grand Knight of the Annapolis Council. The names of the Committee membership and chairman, shall be announced at the regular January business meeting of the Council.

Disbursement of Awards: The disbursement of the award funds shall be by check to the school or the supporting parish for a CCD program. The award recipient will present the check to the receiving institution for application to his or her account.

Submission of Application: Applications should be submitted to **Joseph Woerner, Treasurer at 511 Ridge Road, Annapolis, MD 21401 no later than January 31.**

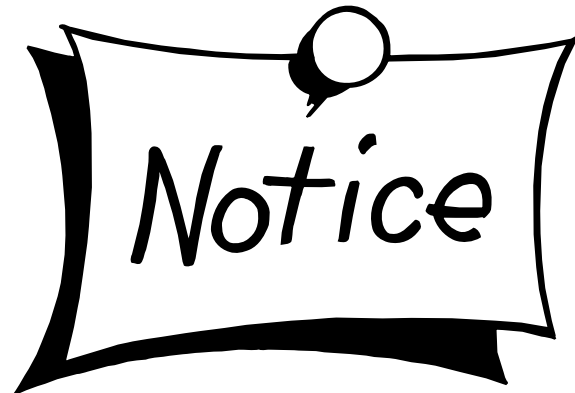

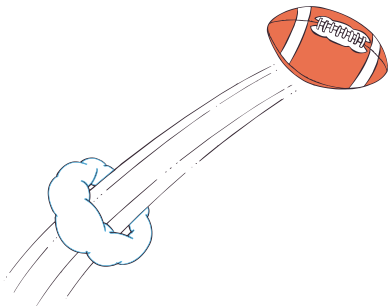

Football Party

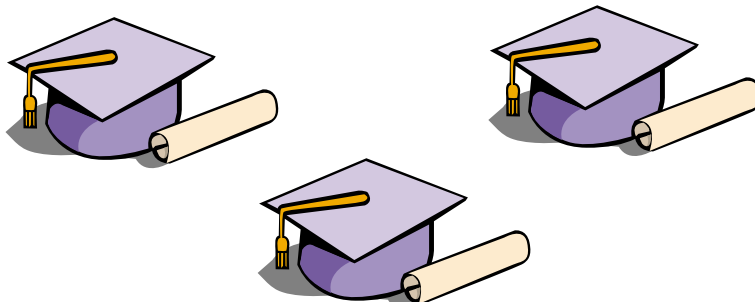

Marriage Redefinition

The definition of marriage between one man and one woman will be coming under heavy attack during the upcoming Maryland legislative session. Governor Martin O'Malley said that he will lead the charge to change the definition of marriage during the upcoming Maryland legislative Session.

Marriage, recognized by societies throughout human history, originates in a simple biological fact. This unique union of one man and one woman is the only human relationship capable of creating children and nourishing them together as father and mother.

Treating heterosexual and same-sex relationships differently is not unjust discrimination, and upholding the truth of marriage does not ignore the rights or equal dignity of all human persons. Indeed Maryland already has granted many rights to domestic partnerships. Rather stripping marriage of its unique connection to parenthood erases a child's birthright to a mother and father, and ignores an essential question of why government favors marriage between one man and one woman over all other relationships.

Conclusion - Drastically altering marriage's legal definition by recognizing same-sex marriage is not necessary to achieve benefits because they already exist in law. Instead, passing such a bill would significantly undermine the legal, social, and cultural status of marriage that is appropriately assigned only to the union of one man and one woman.

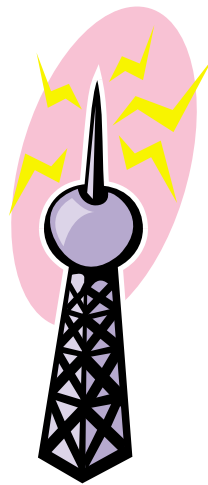

Dear Fellow Knights,

All the Blessings of the New Year to you and your families. As one year closes and a new year dawns it is customary to reflect on how we have accounted for the great gifts and blessings that we have received in the past - and chart a course that will better serve our God in the future. I have embarked with a few other brother Knights

on an effort to spread the Gospel message through the medium of Catholic Radio. Our group has come together with a singular vision and purpose to use the AM and FM radio air waves to touch many souls that would otherwise be unreachable to us in the normal course of our daily work. It is a portion of Christ's vineyard that is already heavily saturated with the sounds, ideas, and promptings of our Protestant brethren - who use it to draw tepid and struggling Catholics away from the One, True, straight path that is our Catholic faith and to draw non-believers into their various denominations. Chesapeake Catholic Radio was formed to inject an authentically Catholic voice into the fray to support struggling and good Catholics to better understand and embrace their faith, and also to introduce Catholic truth into the arena of mass communications in an effort to win new souls for Christ and stop the exodus of Catholics abandoning the Church.

Consider how much of our collective time is spent in our cars traveling from place to place, or in our homes carrying out our daily chores. What a blessing it would be to be able to spend that time learning more about our faith and bringing the 'incarnate Word' to our neighbors through the medium of Catholic radio. Chesapeake Catholic Radio was formed in 2007 and has already procured two broadcast licenses (Pennsville NJ (88.1 FM) covering 15 parishes and Leonardtown MD (91.7 FM) covering 11 parishes in southern Maryland and Eastern Virginia). We have another license pending for Chincoteague MD. We are also pursuing several Annapolis and greater Maryland AM and FM stations that are up for sale or that have gone off the air. It is our intent to aggressively penetrate this market and get solid Catholic content to as many people in the Chesapeake area as rapidly as possible. Each startup station costs about \$70,000.00 to get up and running with small monthly equipment and site rental fees. Some of the more significant radio stations, reaching hundreds of thousands of people every day, require significant capital to procure and run. This small band of brothers at CCR can't do it alone. We need God's army to support our efforts. We are in desperate need of support, financial and prayer, to make this apostolate thrive and become the reality that our Blessed Lord deserves in the Chesapeake Bay area.

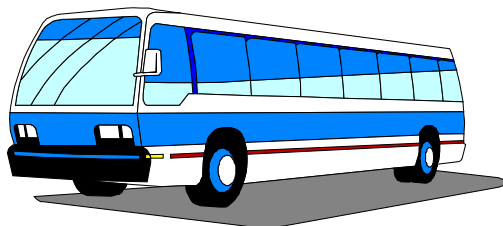

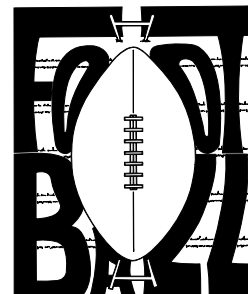

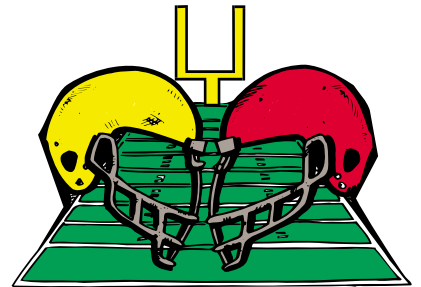
